





Introduction

The natural shift between day and night is a fundamental factor for life on earth. It influences most biological processes in partly still unexplained ways and carries immense value not only for plants and animals but also for humankind. Protecting this natural rhythm pays into and enhances the conservation of the Wadden Sea World Heritage Site.

The Wadden Sea region is one of the darkest regions in Europe. However, it is experiencing an increase in light pollution. This type of pollution encompasses the excessive, misdirected, or inappropriate use of artificial light during the night and poses a growing challenge to the night sky sanctuary. Most animals are nocturnal and experience various irritations by artificial irradiation. Light pollution is increasingly recognized as a serious environmental stressor with profound implications. It causes biodiversity loss and habitat fragmentation, thereby disrupting vital life processes for countless plants and animals, including orientation, reproduction, foraging, and shelter. The effects of light pollution extend to humans, notably affecting our sleep patterns.

Artificial light has played a crucial role in the development of our society, particularly in domestic and urban settings where it has long been associated with the feeling of safety. The negative consequences of light pollution on both the environment and humankind have been largely overlooked for a long time. This is now changing. More research is now conducted on the topic and more general attention is paid. In the Wadden Sea, the Trilateral Dark Sky Initiative aims to highlight the importance of nocturnal darkness for both the ecosystem and humans and intends to unlock the opportunities linked to its preservation.

A main ingredient to reducing artificial light at night is awareness of the value of darkness – both to nature and to humankind. Here, environmental education plays an important role. Guided experience offers from stargazing to night walks on the traces of nightly active animals provide fantastic glimpses into the universe and the world hidden from our eyesight. Being out in nature at night can support our well-being, raise familiarity with darkness, offer new experiences, and stimulate senses other than the eyes while learning about nature's bustling nightlife and understanding the significance of natural rhythms.

Visitor centres, private tour guides, and scientific organisations and initiatives throughout the Wadden Sea provide an increasing choice of nighttime experiences for all ages. This brochure is a collection of offers to give a glimpse into the world of the nightly Wadden experience. It is by no means complete and meant only a snapshot. Yet, it shows the broad scope of already existing activities and offers inspiration to exchange ideas, cooperate, and co-create new offers for visitors and locals to respectfully experience nature's fascinating nightlife and take in the value of darkness. The overview was developed by the International Wadden Sea School and the Trilateral Dark Sky Initiative in the framework of the Partnership Hub.

1. Guided Stargazing Tour on Mandø

Mandø offers a unique opportunity to take an evening walk in the pitch darkness and observe the stars. On such tours, you can delve into the intriguing tales and legends associated with the constellations while also discussing Mandø's exceptional darkness and the efforts involved in establishing Dark Sky Park Mandø. These experiences are made possible with the assistance of two of Mandø's esteemed guides, who are dedicated to providing tailored, informative tours upon request.

2. Dark Sky Tour on Amrum

This tour offers a unique and immersive experience under the night sky, allowing participants to explore the mysteries of the cosmos. To fully engage in this adventure, participants are kindly requested to bring their own bicycles, as the star observation site is situated approximately 1.5 kilometers outside the village, away from the interference of streetlights. During the tour, the guide will share captivating stories from Greek mythology and Japanese legends, adding cultural richness to the celestial exploration. Toward the end of the tour, participants are invited to lie on a comfortable sleeping mat, accompanied by classical piano melodies, and surrounded by the natural sounds of the sea and the delicate scent of sand thyme. The tour guide also offers a “[Dark Dunes](#)” tour on lighthouses, sea signs, and stories.

7. Full moon tour in the harbour of Harlesiel

This tour explores the dark and peaceful natural surroundings along the East Frisian coast, with a focus on Harlesiel. Wildlife thrives in this environment, undisturbed by urban lights and noise. Animals come out at night, and some plants depend on nighttime moths and insects for survival. The tour includes a brief talk about dark skies and light pollution, followed by a 100-minute expedition into the Groden and along the Wadden Sea, where artificial light is minimized for a full nocturnal experience.

8. Dark Sky – Experience the dark side of the Wadden Sea in Harlesiel

The tour along the East Frisian coast, notably in Harlesiel, offers a unique nocturnal experience where profound darkness and silence dominate, unlike urbanized areas. As night falls, a peaceful and unlit environment in the Carolinensiel-Harlesiel coastal region invites various animals to emerge from their hiding places, either seeking refuge or driven by hunger. Additionally, certain plants rely on nocturnal moths and insects for survival. This immersive adventure begins with a 25-minute keynote lecture on dark skies and light pollution, followed by a 100-minute discovery tour through the typical landscape to the mudflats, where artificial light is entirely absent, allowing participants to witness the captivating nighttime world of this coastal haven.

9. Travelling to the stars in Harlesiel

In the past, our Earth could only be explored with the help of the stars and the compass; sextant and nautical charts were the GPS of those times. Dr Andreas Hänel, head of the Dark Sky specialist group, demonstrates in his lecture how the sun, planets and bright stars were "shot". But only after elaborate calculations did we know their position on our globe.

Migratory birds have always used the stars and the earthly magnetic field for orientation - without any aids or calculations. Nowadays, however, their orientation is often disturbed by "light pollution". What this means exactly and how to minimise this disturbance through clever lighting will of course also be discussed. Under clear skies, we will seek orientation among the constellations and planets and explore the celestial objects with binoculars and telescopes.

This lecture provides answers to various questions, such as where to find good stargazing locations, what you can observe in the night sky, the broader value of darkness beyond star lovers, and how to protect it.
